February 24th Bonnie Hallisey, LICSW and an elder caregiver speaks on the challenges of grandparents raising grandchildren.

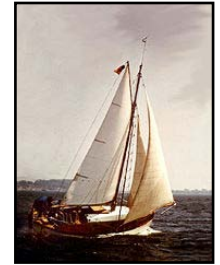
